

COURSE OVERVIEW

In June 2017, CMS released a Survey and Certification Memo 17-30 s (and updated it again in 2018) stating that healthcare facilities should develop and adhere to a compliant water management program. These water management programs help reduce the risk for Legionella and other pathogens in their water systems. Healthcare facilities have complex water systems that may promote growth of pathogenic organisms if not properly maintained. For this reason, the CMS feels that it is essential that nursing homes have a water management program that is effective in limiting the growth and spread of Legionella and other opportunistic pathogens of premise plumbing in their facility.

This webinar will focus on nursing home's responsibility for water management and assessing and controlling Legionnaires' disease. It will also review critical elements of a water management program and how to follow CMS QSO-17-30 leaving you with a better understanding of what to do and how to prepare for an audit.
