ASSISTED LIVING PROVIDERS ARE AT RISK OF CLOSURE

The reimbursement assisted living facilities in Washington currently receive for caring for residents on Medicaid is based on 82% of the average wages from 2022. This means many facilities lose money by accepting Medicaid residents.

Those with a Medicaid occupancy rate of 75% or higher qualify for a **Bridge Rate** add-on of \$21 per resident per day. This Bridge Rate is set to sunset on June 30, 2025 - which puts these facilities at risk.




Assisted Living providers have a Medicaid occupancy rate of 75% or higher.

15 facilities with 90% or higher Medicaid occupancy are at EXTREME risk. The higher the rate, the greater risk of closure.




2500 Washington residents rely on Bridge Rates to receive the care they need. Without assisted living care, they would be homeless, in jail, or in the hospital.
